



Starting from a few best practices, the website now features 100+ articles, case-studies and research papers. These provide information and advice that help governments, businesses and citizens to take action. We build evidence-bases and come up with practical solutions that make a real difference.

Among our most prominent research works are our City Reports. ICCE studied several cities in India on several parameters, an initiative under the Circular Cities project.

ICCE is committed to work with colleges and universities through teaching, applied research, student-led

initiatives and campus management.

We also support and equip circular economy learning amongst school students through skills, knowledge and mindset needed to build a system that works for society, the economy, and the environment.

ICCE is also involved with Atal Incubation Centres and Atal Tinkering labs on research and innovation. We are working with a leading academic institute on hydrogen gas project. In one of our latest endeavours, we are advocating CBSE and AICTE to include circular economy into their mainstream subject. ICCE incubates start-ups to develop circular business models around the waste management sector.

ICCE is launching a journal that shall promote circular economy and resource efficiency.

As ICCE completes a year, demand for our expertise is greater than ever. Around the world, our expertise and invoking power are delivering lasting change.

## CIRCULAR CHAT





"Circular Chat" is a talk show curated by ICCE which invites experts and practitioners from industries, government, multilateral and bilateral organizations and nonprofits to discuss how they are embedding circular practices and sustainability in their business models.

**Season 1** of the show started on the 11th of November, 2020. The chat was held every Wednesday. A total of **23 episodes** were hosted with **renowned personalities** in the first season. This helped us add value to the Circular Economy community through sharing expertise, discussing business cases and knowledge sharing. Circular Chat invites a wide range of stakeholders from across the different regions to address today's problems and their impact on the environment.

After 23 mind-blowing chats spread across 6 months in Season 1, we released the **Second Season** on the 14th of July, 2021. The second season promised a brand new approach. It was launched in a new form with a specific orientation. Industry experts from India would be invited to share their best practices. It will showcase a collaborative solution that brings together key players behind a shared vision of a circular economy, in which the materials never become waste. The first series conferred about the **future of plastics**.







According to the definition from the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP): "In the global context, capacity refers to the ability of individuals and institutions to make and implement decisions and perform functions in an effective, efficient and sustainable manner. At the individual level, capacity building refers to the process of changing attitudes and behaviors-imparting knowledge and developing skills while maximizing the benefits of participation, knowledge exchange and ownership. At the institutional level it focuses on the overall organizational performance and functioning capabilities, as well as the ability of an organization to adapt to change. At the systemic level it emphasizes the overall policy framework in which individuals and organizations operate and interact with the external environment."

It must be brought to light that capacity development is the engine of human development. Capacity building is a process of growth and evolution.

Recognizing the important role of capacity building, ICCE has increasingly engaged in capacity building for Central and State Pollution Control Boards, ULBs, City Mayors as well as other government and industry players. We are working under several government schemes on building capacity through our training programs. Our experts are certified trainers who deliver these programs which are very well accepted by the industry and government.

# CERTIFIED COURSES

In the words of an Austrian management consultant, "The basic economic resource is no longer capital, nor natural resources, nor labor. It is and will be knowledge." With a firm belief in knowledge-sharing, the Council is the first organization in India to launch certified courses in Circular Economy. ICCE has created these courses for students who are interested in exploring the new domain of Circular Economy.


